Houston Film Festival and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) jointly organized the "Third Space Film Festival (CINESPACE)" received a total of 650 units associated with the "space" documentaries from 55 countries of the world, science fiction, comedy, Music, feature films and other video entries, including technology, space, life, meaning of life and other diverse topics.

On November 10, a screening of "Space Film Festival " was held at the Rice University Media Center and 3 best films were selected. In the 13 finalist films, Invisible Border won the third place in the Space Film Festival.

Invisible Border tells the story of a disabled scientist who returned to Earth after completing a one-man mission to space missions. Her success drew the media's attention. In her dialogue with reporters, she shared her views on life, the universe, Faith awareness.

Reeve said: "In the vast and vast universe, the Earth is only a tiny planet. She is our home and we are responsible for her. My original intention is to reflect the idea."

Reeve said he hopes people will get inspiration from her films and think about whether the individual's influence on the earth is positive or negative. "Although we all have different appearances, colors, abilities, physical conditions, or financial capabilities, everyone Have given the opportunity to defend this earth. "

Invisible Borders is co-directed and starred by Shannan Leigh Reeve and Chelese Belmont. The other two best films were the first Austrian film "Lunar" (moon) and the second Hungarian film "Nadir" (lowest point).

Spacefair also set up a special category of awards - Space Research Humanitarian Award, as well as the future Space Exploration Spirit Award.

Organizers donated a total of all award-winning films a total of 26,000 US dollars in prize money. Ellen Ochoa, former astronaut of NASA's Johnson Space Center, part-time director of the Houston Film Festival, filming director and other guests and audience of more than 400 people attended the night's screening.

Ochoa said that NASA has not only cooperative relations with more than a dozen countries, but also links with more than 80 countries in the world. The "Space Film Festival" unit at the Houston Film Festival begins with more than 2 films from the first edition to over 400 from the second edition last year to more than 600 this year. The space film festival continues to receive awards from filmmakers around the world The enthusiasm involved, which shows that the topic of space and people have a close contact.

Ochoa also said that when the "Space Film Festival" was first set up, it was not sure what the future of the event would be and whether it would be sponsored. Today's results are encouraging.
